Can any of y'all tell me who was on the trip, who might have specimens I can look at & photograph, or tell me anything else about the geology at that site? I'm currently writing a note for the January Fossil Record about another brittle star specimen I found in the Fort Worth Formation, so I'm trying to research other known occurrences of Texas brittle stars.
